Arrogance, hubris, in ability to learn from the past---all sorts of factors contributed to the downfall of the Babylonian empire.

We're going to bear down on the second half of this chapter today.

Elohim (e-lo-HEEM) is the plural form of El or Eloah, one of the oldest designations for divinity in the world. The Hebrews borrowed the term El from the Canaanites. It can refer either to the true God or to pagan gods. Though El is used more than 200 times in the Hebrew Bible, Elohim is used more than 2,500 times. Its plural form is used not to indicate a belief in many gods but to emphasize the majesty of the one true God. He is the God of gods, the highest of all. Christians may recognize in this plural form a hint of the Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Elohim occurs thirtytwo times in the first chapter of Genesis. After that the name Yahweh appears as well and is often paired with Elohim and, in the NIV, the two together are translated "the LORD God."

The Writing on the Wall

"Call for Daniel," the queen had said. "He will tell you what the writing means."

5 ¹³So Daniel was brought before the king, and the king said to him, "Are you Daniel, one of the exiles my father the king brought from Judah? ¹⁴I have heard that the spirit of the gods is in you and that you have insight, intelligence and outstanding wisdom.

I like the CLV translation here:

I have ⁺also heard ^{on}about you that the spirit of the ^Mholy^c elohim is in you, and a stream of light and intelligence and excelling wisdom is found in you.

See the text side bar for the use of the word "Elohim." I particularly like the phrase a "stream of light" is found in you.

That ties in with what Daniel said about God in Daniel 2 when He revealed Nebuchadnezzar's dream to him. It also ties in with a description of Jesus in John. God enables us to be a "stream of light."

¹⁵The wise men and enchanters were brought before me to read this writing and tell me what it means, but they could not explain it. ¹⁶Now I have heard that you are able to give interpretations and to solve difficult problems.

Literally, to "untie knots."

If you can read this writing and tell me what it means, you will be clothed in purple and have a gold chain placed around your neck, and you will be made the third highest ruler in the kingdom."

Nabonidus was the first, Belshazzar (his son and Nebuchadnezzar's grandson) was the second, and Daniel would have been the third.

¹⁷Then Daniel answered the king, "You may keep your gifts for yourself and give your rewards to someone else. Nevertheless, I will read the writing for the king and tell him what it means.

Daniel apparently didn't keep the money.

¹⁸"Your Majesty, the Most High God gave your father Nebuchadnezzar sovereignty and greatness and glory and splendor.

God gave him all these things. And notice how despotic he was.

¹⁹Because of the high position he gave him, all the nations and peoples of every language dreaded and feared him.

They "dreaded" and "feared" him. "They shook with fear" is the translation of one of the words used. And "to slink" is the connotation of the other.

Those the king wanted to put to death, he put to death; those he wanted to spare, he spared; those he wanted to promote, he promoted; and those he wanted to humble, he humbled.

Very despotic. Yet God granted him power.

²⁰ But when his heart became arrogant and hardened with pride,

Look at the CLV translation:

(CLV) Dn 5:20

⁺Yet when his heart was exalted[|] and his spirit became

overpowered 'with arrogance', he was deposed from the throne of his kingdom, and they

caused his esteem to pass away from him

So you become two things:

"Arrogant" "Hardened with Pride"

"She-was-mighty spirit-of-him heart-of-him exalted"

he was deposed from his royal throne and stripped of his glory. ²¹He was driven away from people and given the mind of an animal; he lived with the wild donkeys and ate grass like the ox; and his body was drenched with the dew of heaven, until he acknowledged that the Most High God is sovereign over all kingdoms on earth and sets over them anyone he wishes.

In Daniel 2 is says in verse 17 "the lowliest of people."

²²"But you, Belshazzar, his son,^[d] have not humbled yourself, though you knew all this.

Word for humbled: H8214 shphal shef-al'

(Aramaic) corresponding to **H8213**. shaphel to depress or sink (expec. figuratively, to humiliate, intransitive or transitive).

KJV: abase, humble, put down, subdue.

²³Instead, you have set yourself up against the Lord of heaven.

You have exalted yourself "against" the Lord God of heavens.

You had the goblets from his temple brought to you, and you and your nobles, your wives and your concubines drank wine from them. You praised the gods of silver and gold, of bronze, iron, wood and stone, which cannot see or hear or understand. But you did not honor the God who holds in his hand your life (breath) and all your ways (your paths are "to" him).

²⁴Therefore he sent the hand that wrote the inscription.

²⁵ "This is the inscription that was written:

MENE, MENE, TEKEL, PARSIN

²⁶"Here is what these words mean:

In Genesis 41:42 Joseph received a Signet Ring, Robes of fine linen, and a Gold Chain---all symbols of authority.

³⁰That very night Belshazzar, king of the Babylonians,^(h) was slain, ³¹and Darius the Mede took over the kingdom, at the age of sixty-two.⁽¹⁾

We will study more about Darius the next time.
