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Daniel 6 Part 2²

7 In the first year of Belshazzar king of Babylon, Daniel had a dream, and visions passed through his mind as he was lying in bed. He wrote down the substance of his dream.

My study guide today says:

This vision came to Daniel after the reign of Nebuchadnezzar, but before the Babylonian Empire was conquered by the Medo-Persian Empire.

i. Daniel chapters 1 through 6 describe the life and times of Daniel. Chapters 7 through 12 describe visions Daniel had. In order of events, the vision described in Daniel 7 took place during the time between Daniel chapters 4 and 5.

My observations: That comment makes sense. The last scene of Daniel's life story is how he reigned during the times of Darius and later Cyrus. It would be during Cyrus's reign that the Jews would be given the blessing of going back home and beginning to rebuild the temple (see Ezra 1). So it's interesting to me to consider that during Daniel's very long tenure at the very top of the hierarchies of the reigning rulers, Ezra and Nehemiah and possible even Esther were his contemporaries. Here's what one time line says about Daniel:

605 B.C. - Daniel taken Captive

602 B.C. – Nebuchadnezzar has his dream; Daniel brought close to the king.

586 B.C. – Jerusalem destroyed; possible time of Nebuchadnezzar's idol and the fiery furnace in Daniel 3.

566 B.C. – 556 B.C. – Possible time of Nebuchadnezzar's vision of the great tree and his madness.

553 B.C - 549 B.C. - Possible time of Belshazzar's co-regency and Daniel's visions in Daniel 7.

548 - 547 B.C - Daniel's vision of the ram and he goat in Daniel 8.

539 B.C. – Belshazzar's vision of the handwriting on the wall; Cyrus, king of Persia, conquers Babylon. Darius the Mede, likely appointed by Cyrus, assumes power in Babylon. Daniel reads Jeremiah and prays and fasts for Jerusalem.

538 B.C – Cyrus decrees the Jews can return to Jerusalem and rebuild the temple.

537 B.C. – About 50,000 Jews return, led by Zerubbabel and Joshua the high priest. Daniel, about age 83, has prophetic visions of the end times (Daniel 10).

536 – 535 B.C. – Daniel's heavenly vision and conversation with a heavenly being.

535 B.C. – Possible time of Daniel's death? (See scholar's opinion below).

530 – 522 B.C. – Cambyses reigns; the rebuilding of the temple is stopped.

522-486 B.C. – Darius 1 reigns and the rebuilding of the temple is renewed in 520 B.C. It is dedicated in 515 B.C.

These dates are subject to revision. Different time lines show different dates. I guess some speculation is involved.

Here is one scholar's speculation as to when Daniel died.

Posted on **May 20, 2007** by **John Oakes**wrote in **Daniel**, **General**, **History**. Question:

- 1) At what age did Daniel die?
- 2) How did Daniel come to go to Babylon in 606/5 BC?

Answer:

We know from Babylonian records that Nebuchadnezzar campaigned in Canaan in 606/605 BC. His father died during that time. The evidence says that Nebuchadnezzar came to Jerusalem, but the Jews chose to submit and give tribute rather than fight. Daniel and his friends were taken as hostages to Babylon against the annual tribute. I assume that they were children of the aristocracy, as was the norm for such tribute hostages in the ancient

world. My guess is that they were teenagers—probably between, say 14 and 20. Therefore, Daniel was probably born about 620 BC. We know he survived the conquest of Babylon by Cyrus in 538 BC. It is hard to guess how long he survived this event, but let us suppose that he died somewhere between 535 and 530 BC. That would make him about 85 to ninety years old at his death.

Does this make sense?
