Daniel 7 New International Version (NIV) I'll pick up here.

"While I was thinking about the horns, there before me was another horn, a little one, which came up among them; and three of the first horns were uprooted before it. This horn had eyes like the eyes of a human being and a mouth that spoke boastfully.

Again I ask, who is this little "horn." It is seen in the NIV study bible as the anti-Christ or a world power sharing in the characteristics of the anti-christ. It gives these Scriptures in reference:

Who could this be (or have been)? There are many takes on this. Antioch Epiphanes. Others, Caligula, and/or other Roman emperors who attempted to set up a statue of himself in the temple and be worshipped. This is nothing new. Even in Daniel 6, only the king was to be "prayed to" and worshipped.

Some see him as an end times ruler that will be the final manifestation of evil. Apparently, this is what the early church fathers believed.

Some would argue that the little horn represents one of the pagan Roman rulers (e.g., Julius Caesar or Vespasian). A great variety of biblical scholars, however, have forcefully contended that Daniel's little horn and Paul's "man of sin" (2 Thessalonians 2:3ff) appear to represent the same hostile force. This was the general view of the "church fathers" (see Newton, 462, 463), and such has been maintained in modern times. Since the "man of sin" is obviously a part of "the falling away" from the primitive faith, the opposing force would seem to be a **religious** one (see Workman 1988, 414-436).<sup>3</sup>

## There have been many speculations.

While it's tempting to associate this little horn with what's come to be known as "the antichrist," (also associated with the beasts of Revelation), neither book uses that phrase to describe the ones being spoken of. Paul doesn't either.

John specifically defines the antichrists this way.

### 1 John 2:18

<sup>18</sup> Dear children, this is the last hour; and as you have heard that the antichrist is coming, even now many antichrists have come. This is how we know it is the last hour. <sup>19</sup> They went out from us, but they did not really belong to us. For if they had belonged to us, they would have remained with us; but their going showed that none of them belonged to us.

So whoever they were, "they went out from us." So while there are "many antichrists," the Bible doesn't dogmatically say this "man of sin" is "the" antichrist. Again, let's review what the early church fathers said according to the source referenced below:

...biblical scholars, however, have forcefully contended that Daniel's little horn and Paul's "man of sin" (2 Thessalonians 2:3ff) appear to represent the same hostile force. This was the general view of the "church fathers" (see Newton, 462, 463), and such has been maintained in modern times.

Either way, this fourth kingdom (begun with the Roman Empire and shown as being at least the "spirit" of all subsequent world rules that have occurred since that time) dominates until this takes place.

"thrones were set in place, and the Ancient of Days took his seat. His clothing was as white as snow; the hair of his head was white like wool. <sup>14</sup>The hair on his head was white like wool, as white as snow, and his eyes were like blazing fire.

Revelation 1:14 – referring to Jesus. Like Father, like Son!

# The "Ancient of Days" refers to God. This hair color is also spoken of in Revelation.

His throne was flaming with fire, and its wheels were all ablaze.

## Remember the vision in Ezekiel?

#### **Ezekiel 1:15-21**

<sup>15</sup> As I looked at the living creatures, I saw a wheel on the ground beside each creature with its four faces. <sup>16</sup> This was the appearance and



structure of the wheels: They sparkled like topaz<sup>4</sup>, and all four looked alike. Each appeared to be made like a wheel

intersecting a wheel<sup>5</sup>.



#### **Ezekiel 1:26-27**

<sup>26</sup>Above the vault over their heads Vault: or "atmosphere." Likened to the visible arch of the sky



was what looked like a throne of lapis lazuli (possibly sapphire<sup>6</sup>), and high above on the throne was a

figure like that of a man. <sup>27</sup>I saw that from what appeared to be his waist up he looked like glowing metal, as if full of fire, and that from there down he looked like fire; and brilliant light surrounded him.

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<sup>10</sup> A river of fire<sup>7</sup> was flowing, coming out from before him.
Thousands upon thousands attended him; ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him.

The NIV study bible says that in Ancient poetic references in this part of the world, "10,000" was the counterpart of "1,000." Not literal numbers as much as poetic ways of contrasting. Like a little kid might say "there was gazillion of things out there." Just a manner of speech.

The court was seated, and the books were opened.

## John echoes this language in Revelation.

"Then I continued to watch because of the boastful words the horn was speaking. I kept looking until the beast was slain and its body destroyed and thrown into the blazing fire. <sup>12</sup> (The other beasts had been stripped of their authority, but were allowed to live for a period of time.)

<sup>12</sup> And I saw the dead, great and small, standing before the throne, and books were opened. Another book was opened, which is the book of life. The dead were judged according to what they had done as recorded in the books. Rev 20:12

coming with the clouds of heaven. He approached the Ancient of Days and was led into his presence. <sup>14</sup>He was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all nations and peoples of every language worshiped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed.

Again, this is obviously referring to Jesus, and to giving the rule back to the people of God. More on this next time.
