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#### Daniel 7

<sup>13</sup>"In my vision at night I looked, and there before me was one like a son of man coming with the clouds of heaven. He approached the Ancient of Days and was led into his presence. <sup>14</sup>He was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all nations and peoples of every language worshiped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed.

As I noted yesterday, this is obviously referring to Jesus, and to giving the rule back to the people of God. When did Jesus do this? Has he done it already?

One of the things I've observed in my study was that apocalyptic literature was written in a time of distress for the people of God (in this time period, Israel). It spoke of their restoration to power. Of course, this symbol morphs in the bible to be shown as meaning all people, who will all through Christ be part of the Israel of God.

So I want to consider what is for me a new way of looking at these Scriptures. The depiction of the world-ruling "beast" empires seems to stop with the one most identify with the Roman Empire. Of

course, it's the Roman empire that is in existence when God's Son, the Christ, comes into the world.

# Here is what one source says<sup>3</sup>:

The prophet Daniel declared: "And in the days of those kings shall the God of heaven set up a kingdom which shall never be destroyed" (2:44). The "kings" of the prophecy were Roman kings (the fourth part of the image of Nebuchadnezzar's dream [2:31ff]). The Roman Empire came into dominance in 63 B.C. and it fell in A.D. 476; hence, it follows that the kingdom of God was established at some point between those two dates—or else Daniel was a false prophet! There is no evidence that the Roman Empire will be revived to accommodate Daniel's prediction.

So if this is true (and for some reason, this is certainly making sense to me), the kingdom of God (not a materialistic kingdom, but a spiritual kingdom not of this world<sup>4</sup> was begun when Christ came). The article referenced above says the same thing.

John the Baptizer: "The Kingdom Is Near"

John the Baptizer, Jesus himself, and the twelve disciples all preached that the kingdom was "at hand," literally meaning "is come near" (Matthew 3:2; 4:17; 10:7; cf. Luke 21:30 for the meaning of "at hand").

Thus, they preached the nearness of the kingdom of God, and such can scarcely be harmonized with the notion that it hasn't come.

While it is true that the expression "at hand" can be used prophetically of that which is yet in the distant future, other contextual considerations—either immediate or remote—must indicate that fact. The term is used figuratively in James 5:8 to reflect an intense expectation—regardless of the time factor.

James 5:8 New International Version (NIV)

<sup>8</sup>You too, be patient and stand firm, because the Lord's coming is near.

Note: The Early Church seemed by and large to expect the manifestation of Christ's coming in their lifetime. But in one sense, and perhaps in a way they simply took years (maybe even centuries) to accept, the kingdom of God, which had drawn near, was acceptable in a heartbeat at a moment's notice, if Christ sought to manifest it. Notice this next passage dealt with by this article.

## The Prophecy of Christ

#### Christ exclaimed:

Verily I say unto you, There are some here of them that stand by, who shall in no wise taste of death, till they see the kingdom of God come with power (Mark 9:1).

Either the kingdom came within the lifetime of those to whom he referred, or they are getting very old!

Observe, please: Jesus promised that the kingdom would come with power (Mark 9:1). But that power would accompany the reception of the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:8). Thus, the kingdom would come with the arrival of the Spirit. But the Holy Spirit came on the day of Pentecost—some fifty days after Christ's death (Acts 2:4). Therefore, the kingdom was established at that time.

Here's my take, which is slightly different than this author's.

They did see the Kingdom come with Power, when Christ manifested the heavenly dimension to them via the Spirit in this moment!

The kingdom of heaven had come near, and was accessible at any time.

It was especially manifest in times of intense suffering and persecution.

#### Acts 9

# The Stoning of Stephen

<sup>54</sup> When the members of the Sanhedrin heard this, they were furious and gnashed their teeth at him. <sup>55</sup> But Stephen, full of the Holy Spirit, looked up to heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. <sup>56</sup> Look," he said, "I see heaven open and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God."

## Some would say that this is what is meant by this verse:

Revelation 20 New International Version (NIV)

# The Thousand Years

**20** And I saw an angel coming down out of heaven, having the key to the Abyss and holding in his hand a great chain. <sup>2</sup>He seized the dragon, that ancient serpent, who is the devil, or Satan, and bound him for a thousand years. <sup>3</sup>He threw him into the Abyss, and locked and sealed it over him, to keep him from deceiving the nations anymore until the thousand years were ended. After that, he must be set free for a short time.

<sup>4</sup>I saw thrones on which were seated those who had been given authority to judge. And I saw the souls of those who had been beheaded because of their testimony about Jesus and because of the word of God. They<sup>[a]</sup> had not worshiped the beast or its image and had not received its mark on their foreheads or their hands. They came to life and reigned with Christ a thousand years. <sup>5</sup> (The rest of the dead did not come to life until the thousand years were ended.) This is the first resurrection. <sup>6</sup> Blessed and holy

are those who share in the first resurrection. The second death has no power over them, but they will be priests of God and of Christ and will reign with him for a thousand years.

Ok. So let me share some key phrases from this passage, and show how the Scriptures could support a view that Satan was cast out at the death of Christ, and the "kingdom" was given to the people of God, who were made priests and kings by Christ!

#### That's what Paul did!
