From that I perceive Daniel "understanding" he was seeking and "the vision" might be coupled with the phrase "into see of me"---and I'm trying to figure out what that means. "Into" "see" "of me"? I'm looking at it deeply within? I'm trying to see it "into" it's depth in me, in my mind? I'm cogitating on it, giving it my best shot? This ties in with something we said at Bible study last night about the proper approach to a revelation by God as stated by Jesus in Mark 4:

²⁰ `And these are they who on the good ground have been sown: who do hear the word, and receive, and do bear fruit, one thirty-fold, and one sixty, and one an hundred.' **Mark 4**

You are to "hear" the word in this case, and "receive it"---deeply, I imagine.

¹⁶And I heard a man's voice from the Ulai calling, "Gabriel, tell this man the meaning of the vision."

Gabriel is an angel of God, who stands in the presence of God. He was the one who told both Elizabeth and Mary about the births, respectively, of John and Jesus.

¹⁹The angel said to him, "I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I have been sent to speak to you and to tell you this good news.

He must be a high ranking angel of great authority. He apparently is held in esteem by other faiths besides Christianity and Judaism.

In the **Abrahamic religions**, **Gabriel (/ˈɡeɪbriəl/; Hebrew**: גַּבְרִיאֵל *Gabַrīʾēl*, 'God is my Strength'; **Greek**: Γαβριήλ, *Gabriél*; **Latin**: *Gabriel*, *Fortitudo*

Dei; Coptic: المالة , Gabriêl; Amharic: ٦-חרله،, Gabrəʾel; Aramaic: كبطتام،, romanized: Gabrīʾ ēl; Arabic: بجبراليل, Jibrīl or جبراليل, Jibrāʾīl) is an archangel, first described in the Hebrew Bible.

In the Hebrew Bible, Gabriel appears to the prophet **Daniel** to explain his visions (**Daniel 8**:15–26, **9**:21–27). The archangel also appears in the **Book of Enoch** and other ancient Jewish writings. Alongside archangel **Michael**, Gabriel is described as the **guardian angel** of Israel, defending its people against the angels of the other nations.^[6]

The **Gospel of Luke** relates the stories of the **Annunciation**, in which the angel Gabriel appears to **Zechariah** and the **Virgin Mary**, foretelling the births of **John the Baptist** and **Jesus**, respectively (**Luke 1:11–38**). Many Christian traditions—including **Anglicanism**, **Eastern Orthodoxy**, and **Roman Catholicism**—revere Gabriel as a **saint**.^{[1][7]}

Islam regards Gabriel (**Jibreel**) as an **archangel** sent by God to various prophets, including **Muhammad**.^[8] The first five verses of the **AI-Alaq**, the 96th chapter of the **Quran**, is believed by Muslims to have been the first verses revealed by Jibreel to Muhammad.^[citation needed]

The Latter Day Saints hold that the angel Gabriel is the same individual as the prophet Noah in his mortal ministry.^{[9][10]}

Yazidis consider Gabriel one of the Seven Mysteries, the heptad to which God entrusted the world and sometimes identified with **Melek Taus**.^[11]

According to the ancient **Gnostic** manuscript, the **Holy Book of the Great Invisible Spirit**, Gabriel is a divine being and inhabitant of the **Pleroma** who existed prior to the **Demiurge**.^[12]

The NIV says "The Son of Man is Jesus' most common title for himself, used 81 times in the Gospels and never used by anyone bu Jesus there. Elsewhere it is used by Stephen and in John's vision. . .it is considered a Messianic title.

In Mark 8, Peter calls Him the Messiah, and in juxtaposition to that, Jesus uses the phrase Son of Man to describe himself.
