Pounding on the door, they shouted to the old man who owned the house, "Bring out the man who came to your house so we can have sex with him."... the man took his concubine and sent her outside to them, and they raped her and abused her throughout the night, and at dawn they let her go. . . his concubine, fallen in the doorway of the house, with her hands on the threshold. . . 9 When he reached home, he took a knife and cut up his concubine, limb by limb, into twelve parts and sent them into all the areas

As a result, the Israelites fought against the Benjamites and destroyed all but 600 of the

Hosea 10:9-15 New International Version (NIV)

"Since the days of Gibeah, you have sinned, Israel, and there you have remained.[Or "there a stand was taken"]
Will not war again overtake
the evildoers in Gibeah?

The crime of Gibeah was a particularly evil crime in the early days of the nation. The tribe of Benjamin (the Benjamites) engaged in particularly corrupt behavior. See the side bar for more details.

When I please, I will punish them; nations will be gathered against them to put them in bonds for their double sin.

"Ephraim is a trained heifer that loves to thresh; so I will put a yoke on her fair neck.

The NIV study Bible says "up to now Ephraim (referring to all of Israel by this leading tribe) had been as contented as a young cow that ate while threshing grain. But now God would cause Israel (called both Ephraim and Jacob in the next verse) to the heavey work of plowing and harrowing under a yoke---a picture of going in the Assyrian and later Babylonian captivities.

I will drive Ephraim,
Judah must plow,
and Jacob must break up the ground.

Sow righteousness for yourselves,
reap the fruit of unfailing love,
and break up your unplowed ground;
for it is time to seek the LORD,

until he comes

and showers his righteousness on you.

What a beautiful visual. "Sow righteousness." I like that. Do a lot of good, sow good things. "Reap unfailing love." Let me look at the literal transliteration.

(CLV) Ho 10:12

Sow for yourselves 'righteousness; Reap' the <sup>7</sup>fruit of kindness; Till for yourselves the fallow ground. Then is the time to seek after Yahweh, Until He shall come and direct righteousness to you.

"Till your fallow ground." I wonder if we all have "fallow ground"—"unplowed" (undeveloped) areas of our lives that must grow and become fruitful for the LORD's purposes. The New Testament seems to imply the need for constant growth. See text box and Scripture below.

1 Peter 2:2 [Full Chapter] Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation . . .

Ephesians 4:15Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. . .

2 Thessalonians 1:3[ Thanksgiving and Prayer ] We ought always to thank God for you, brothers and sisters, and rightly so, because your faith is growing more and more, and the love all of you have for one another is increasing.
