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# **Amos Introduction Part 6**<sup>2</sup>

I find this next section very interesting. It begins this way in the NIV study bible introduction notes: The God for whom Amos speaks is not just the God of Israel. He is the Great King who rule the whole universe. Because He is all-sovereign, the God of Israel holds the history and destiny of all peoples and of the world in his hands. Israel must know not only that he is Lord of her future, but also that he is Lord over all, and that he has purposes and concerns that reach far beyond her borders. Israel had a unique, but not exclusive claim on God.

In other words God is the Lord of all. And Jesus was going to come and expand who belonged in the Kingdom of God. Let's look at the Scriptures cited. Enjoy!

Amos 4:13 New International Version (NIV)

13 He who forms the mountains,
who creates the wind,
and who reveals his thoughts to mankind,

# God "forms" mountains. Just take a quick read of the process geologists have discovered God uses.

Mountains are formed by movement within the Earth's crust. The crust itself is made up of several large plates, called tectonic plates, which are free floating. These huge chunks of the Earth's crust move within molten rock called magma, which allows them to shift and collide over time. Even though humans live on the crust, they do not often feel these movements as they are very slow, and the sheer size of each plate is so large. Nevertheless, these shifts still have great impacts on human life as the movement of plates is what creates changes in the geographical structure of the surface of the earth. In this way, mountains are created over time. When these plates collide, there is a great deal of mass and pressure which suddenly comes to a stop, and it is this movement that forces the Earth into buckles or protrusions which are known as mountains. Depending on how these plates move or collide, one of three types of mountains can be formed. The three types of mountains or mountain ranges are: volcanic, fold, and block mountains, each of which is formed in a different way.<sup>3</sup>

who turns dawn to darkness, and treads on the heights of the earth the LORD God Almighty is his name.

The God of the Bible is the cosmic Creator. God exerted tremendous power when He created the Universe. Nothing but God existed before He brought creation into being. I like this explanation of how God created mountains, and all things over time.<sup>4</sup>

riches of God's grace \*that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and understanding, \*he<sup>[c]</sup> made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ, <sup>10</sup> to be put into effect when the times reach their fulfillment—to bring unity to all things in heaven and on earth under Christ.

#### Christians believe that Jesus of Nazareth was the

human incarnation of that same Mystery a mere 2,000 years ago, when we were perhaps ready for this revelation. Christ is not Jesus' last name, but the title of his historical and cosmic purpose. Jesus presents himself as the "Anointed" or *Christened One* who was human and divine united in one human body—as our model and exemplar. Peter seems to get this, at least once (Matthew 16:16), but like most of the church, he

"At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. Just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, he sa heaven being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove." Mark 1:9-10

also seems to regress. Christ is our shortcut word for "The Body of God" or "God materialized." [2] This Christ is much bigger and older than either Jesus of Nazareth or the Christian religion, because **the Christ is whenever the material and the divine co-exist—which is always and everywhere.** 

Ilia Delio writes, "The conventional visualization of the physical world was changed by Einstein's special theory of relativity, which showed that matter itself was a form of energy. . . . For all practical purposes, energy is the 'real world.'" There it is: science revealing that everything is both matter and energy/spirit co-inhering as one; this is a Christocentric world. This realization changes everything. Matter has become a holy thing and the material world is the place where we can comfortably worship God just by walking on matter, by loving it, by respecting it. The Christ is God's active power inside of the physical world.

# Ok, that was a brief diversion. But let's continue in Amos. And let's think of God's greater purposes for the world that is greater than even Israel.

Here are a few other concepts the introduction directs our attention to, from the introduction to the book of Psalms in a section entitled "Major Themes." I'll briefly summarize them and include on Scripture for each.

1. The gravitational center of life and history and the whole creation (heaven and earth) is God, Yahweh,.

2. God will not tolerate any worldly power that opposes or ignores him.

3. He opposes the proud, those who rely on their own resources (and/or the gods they have contrived).

4. He is the ultimate Executor of justice among humans (to avenge oneself is an act of the proud).

Do not take revenge, my dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it **is** written: "It **is mine** to avenge; I will repay," says the Lord.

5. The Lord has chosen the Israelites to be his servant people, his inheritance among the nations.

#### So the book concludes:

Israel had a unique claim on God. But not an exclusive claim on God. She needed to remember not His covenant commitments to her, but her covenant obligations to Him.
