## Judgment on the Idolaters

**9** Then I heard him call out in a loud voice, "Bring near those who are appointed to execute judgment on the city, each with a weapon in his hand." <sup>2</sup> And I saw six men coming from the direction of the upper gate, which faces north, each with a deadly weapon in his hand. With them was a man clothed in linen who had a writing kit at his side. They came in and stood beside the bronze altar.

Note: It's fascinating to consider the interface between heaven and earth. There are angels, servants of God that are "ministering spirits." Now I thought the word for "ministering" was going to diakonia, the word from which we derive "deacon." It literally means "through (dia)-servant"---a servant through whom God flows in service. But the actual word is:

G3010 leitourgikos li-toorg-ik-os'

from the same as G3008;

functional publicly ("liturgic"); i.e. beneficient.

It's the word from which we get liturgy, which is a form of service offered to God by the Greek Orthodox. They are somehow involved in what we see happening on earth.

My friend Jeff often talks about the multi-dimensionality of our existence.

It's fascinating to consider what the "fabric of Being" is woven with!

Note: The NIV study bible says that God is beginning to vacate the temple. His glory is moving to the threshold, to the door!

Then the LORD called to the man clothed in linen who had the writing kit at his side 'and said to him, "Go throughout the city of Jerusalem and put a mark on the foreheads of those who grieve and lament over all the detestable things that are done in it."

Note: So this "ministering spirit," a man clothed with linen who "marks" God's people with special mark. This is interesting to me, because the "marks" aren't physical, as much as they are "spiritual" marks that God notes. Cain had one (Genesis 4:15) and his may have been a literal mark. We've all heard of the mark of the beast. A source I often quote says this:

It is important to realize that a medical implant chip is not the mark of the beast. The mark of the beast will be something given only to those who worship the Antichrist. Having a medical or financial microchip inserted into your right hand or forehead is not the mark of the beast. The mark of the beast will be an end-times identification required by the Antichrist in order to buy or sell, and it will be given only to those who worship the Antichrist.

Many good expositors of Revelation differ widely as to the exact nature of the mark of the beast. Besides the implanted chip view, other speculations include an ID card, a microchip, a barcode that is tattooed into the skin, or simply a mark that identifies someone as being faithful to the Antichrist's kingdom. This last view requires the least speculation, since it does not add any more information to what the Bible gives us. In other words, any of these things are possible, but at the same time they are all speculations. We should not spend a lot of time speculating on the precise details.<sup>4</sup>

<sup>§</sup>As I listened, he said to the others, "Follow him through the city and kill, without showing pity or compassion. <sup>§</sup>Slaughter the old men, the young men and women, the mothers and children, but do not touch anyone who has the mark. Begin at my sanctuary."

Note: I think this is interesting. The punishers were to begin at God's sanctuary! This sounds like this Scripture:

1 Peter 4:17

<sup>17</sup>For it is time for judgment to begin with God's household; and if it begins with us, what will the outcome be for those who do not obey the gospel of God?

Remember---God's judgment is not retributive, but restorative. At least, it's primarily "restorative." But notice what Ezekiel mentions a few verses later. It seems like "what goes around" does "come around." That always makes for a good movie! Paul apparently did too. Look at what he said about one of the bad guys in his life.

2 Timothy 4:14 New International Version (NIV)

<sup>14</sup>Alexander the metalworker did me a great deal of harm. The Lord will repay him for what he has done.

Maybe God likes good endings too, where the bad guys do their due! So they began with the old men who were in front of the temple.

## Note: The older men, the more mature, were the most accountable and the first punished!

Then he said to them, "Defile the temple and fill the courts with the slain. Go!" So they went out and began killing throughout the city. \*While they were killing and I was left alone, I fell facedown, crying out, "Alas, Sovereign LORD! Are you going to destroy the entire remnant of Israel in this outpouring of your wrath on Jerusalem?"

<sup>9</sup>He answered me, "The sin of the people of Israel and Judah is exceedingly great; the land is full of bloodshed and the city is full of injustice. They say, 'The LORD has forsaken the land; the LORD does not see.' <sup>10</sup>So I will not look on them with pity or spare them, but I will bring down on their own heads what they have done."

## Note: God says "I will bring down on their own heads what they have done!"

<sup>11</sup>Then the man in linen with the writing kit at his side brought back word, saying, "I have done as you commanded."

Note: Wow. Who knows what's happening "behind" the veil of eternity! God does, and if we're "on," we can too!
