Let's pick up on that theme, and study one more aspect about it. Then let's continue on into Amos .

I want to start with just one more observation about the unraveling of the cosmos because of sin.

It stems from these two Scriptural understandings.

1. Christ is the one who gives matter mass.

Colossians 1:17New International Version

<sup>17</sup> He is before all things, and in him all things hold together.

### Let me look up alternate translations to get this point across.

KJ21And He is before all things, and by Him all things consist.

ASVand he is before all things, and in him all things consist.

AMPAnd He Himself existed and is before all things, and in Him all things hold together.

[His is the controlling, cohesive force of the universe.]

AMPCAnd He Himself existed before all things, and in Him all things consist (cohere, are held together).

CSB He is before all things, and by him all things consist.

CSB He is before all things, and by him all things hold together.

CEB He existed before all things, and all things are held together in him.

CJB He existed before all things, and he holds everything together.

CEV God's Son was before all else, and by him everything is held together.

DARBYAND \*he\* is before all, and all things subsist together by him.

DLNTAND He Himself is before all things, and all things have existence in Him.

DRAAND he is before all, and by him all things consist.

LEB and he himself is before all things, and in him all things are held together,

TLBHE was before all else began and it is his power that holds everything together.

MSG So spacious is he, so expansive, that everything of God finds its proper place in him without crowding. Not only that, but all the broken and dislocated pieces of the universe—people and things, animals and atoms—get properly fixed and fit together in vibrant harmonies, all because of his death, his blood that poured down from the cross.

Christ gives matter "mass." If Christ was taken out of the picture, all existence would unravel into "nothingness." There are several references to this in the New Testament. I'll key of one of them:

### **Romans 9:22**

What if God, although choosing to show his wrath and make his power known, bore with great patience the objects of his wrath—prepared for **destruction**?

### So the Greek word for destruction comes from this related word:

G622 apollumi ap-ol'-loo-mee

from G575 and the base of G3639;

to destroy fully (reflexively, to perish, or lose), literally or figuratively.

KJV: destroy, die, lose, mar, perish.

### Here are its cognates.

<b>G575</b> apo apo'	G3639 olethros ol'-eth-ros
a primary particle;	from a primary ollumi (to destroy; a prolonged form);
"off," i.e. away (from something near), in various senses (of place, time, or relation; literal or figurative). In composition (as a prefix) it usually denotes separation, departure, cessation, completion, reversal, etc.	ruin, i.e. death, punishment.

### Another word us is katalou.

G2647 kataluo kat-al-oo'-o

from G2596 and G3089;

to loosen down (disintegrate), i.e. (by implication) to demolish (literally or figuratively); specially (compare **G2646**) to halt for the night.

So Christ gives matter mass. And when sin, that which misses the mark of Christ's life, kicks in, then the unraveling of the universe kicks in. Like it did at the flood---sin causes the destruction of the cosmos. We are all interrelated. Sin unravels being. God stops it through Christ who is forever dying with and resurrecting this existence of ours. How much He loves us!

Let's now go to chapter 6.

# **Woe to the Complacent**

**6** Woe to you who are complacent in Zion, and to you who feel secure on Mount Samaria, you notable men of the foremost nation, to whom the people of Israel come!

# He points them to other examples of destruction nearby---Kalneh, Hamath and Gath.
