So apparently much of this book is paralleled in Jeremiah 49, giving some to believe that Obadiah was a contemporary of Jeremiah. Edom felt secure because of her mountain fortresses and her wise men. But Obadiah announces God's judgment on her for her hostility to Israel---and for standing aloof in the face of her humiliation. She apparently had hidden treasures. The Ancient Greek historian Diodorus Siculus indicates the Edomites put their wealth---accumulated from trade---in vaults in rocks. She also was to be betrayed by those who were intimates with her. Edom would suffer from a trusted friend as well---one who ate His own bread. Jesus did too! It brought to mind Christ's sadness conveyed in this verse: Psalm 41<sup>9</sup> Even my close friend, someone I trusted, one who shared my bread, has turned (lifted up his heal in Hebrew) against me. Perhaps you too have been hurt that way---or hurt others that way! Let's continue our study.

be drunk and stripped naked. In other words, what you called for will happen to you.

While God punishes and even wreaks vengeance, He apparently wants us to be careful about the way we act when He does. And He watches our hearts too, because He's not pleased when perpetual hatred and anger is in our hearts. Apparently in Genesis 33 Esau himself had dealt with his, somehow the attitude of anger and even bitter hatred against the descendants of Jacob. He may have dealt with the issues face to face with Jacob---but apparently something was communicated to his descendants.

As you have done, it will be done to you; your deeds will return upon your own head.

If there were eschatological glimmerings in the mentioning of that "that day" in verse 8, it becomes a strong ray in this verse, the study Bible says. The day of the Lord brings judgment to all nations and vindication to the descendants of Jacob.
