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Micah 3²

Micah 2 is filled with prophecies that pertain to the Lord Jesus Christ. The picture described in the last verse speaks volumes. God is to "gather" all of Jacob. We know from the New Testament that not "all of Israel" is of fleshly Israel. In Romans 9:6 it says: It is not as though God's word had failed. For not all who are descended from Israel are Israel. The children of the promise who are regarded as Abraham's offspring. So this prophecies swells up into a prophecy about the Christ. Let's look for Christ sightings in it. Enjoy.

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Exodus 23:2

"Do not follow the crowd in doing wrong. When you give testimony in a lawsuit, do not pervert justice by siding with the crowd,

Exodus 23:6

"Do not deny justice to your poor people in their lawsuits.

Leviticus 19:15

"Do not pervert justice; do not show partiality to the poor or favoritism to the great, but judge your neighbor fairly.

Deuteronomy 16:19

Do not pervert justice or show partiality. Do not accept a bribe, for a bribe blinds the eyes of the wise and twists the words of the innocent.

Deuteronomy 16:20

Follow justice and justice alone, so that you may live and possess the land the Lord your God is giving you.

CLV translation:

(CLV) Dt 16:20

Justice and justice only shall you pursue, so that you may ^llive and tenant "the land "that Yahweh your Elohim is giving to you.

In this case, the word used for justice is:

H6664 tsedeg tseh'-dek

from H6663;

the right (natural, moral or legal); also (abstractly) equity or (figuratively) prosperity.

Micah 3

New International Version

Leaders and Prophets Rebuked

3 Then I said,

"Listen, you leaders of Jacob, you rulers of Israel.

Should you not embrace justice,

What a beautiful phrase! To embrace justice! Literally, to "know" justice. The same word is the word used for Adam "knowing" his wife Eve and her becoming pregnant. Hence, I guess, the "embracing" justice. The word for justice in Hebrew is:

H4941 mishpat mish-pawt'

properly, a verdict (favorable or unfavorable) pronounced judicially, especially a sentence or formal decree (human or (participant's) divine law, individual or collective), including the act, the place, the suit, the crime, and the penalty; abstractly, justice, including a participant's right or privilege (statutory or customary), or even a style.

from H8199 - to judge, i.e. pronounce sentence (for or against); by implication, to vindicate or punish; by extenssion, to govern; passively, to litigate (literally or figuratively).

So that's what leaders are supposed to do---embrace "justice."

See the side bar for other Scriptures speaking of justice.

² you who hate good and love evil;

Fascinating concept. "Hating" the good, but loving the evil. Sounds like the Scripture in John 3 quoting Jesus after His "for God so loved the world" speech.

who tear the skin from my people and the flesh from their bones;

3 who eat my people's flesh, strip off their skin and break their bones in pieces; who chop them up like meat for the pan,

like flesh for the pot?"

God holds leadership in high accountability. And He wants justice for people.

⁴Then they will cry out to the LORD, but he will not answer them.

At that time he will hide his face from them because of the evil they have done.

John 3

¹⁹ This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, but people loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil.

The Greek word for "evil" is the word:

G5337 phaulos fow'-los

apparently a primary word;

"foul" or "flawy", i.e. (figuratively) wicked.

It sounds like the word "foul."

²⁰ Everyone who does evil hates the light, and will not come into the light for fear that their deeds will be exposed.

When it comes time for them to need help, God will ignore them the same way they ignored Him!

⁵ This is what the LORD says:

"As for the prophets
who lead my people astray,
they proclaim 'peace'
if they have something to eat,
but prepare to wage war against anyone
who refuses to feed them.

Wow. Such a warning to not do what you do, ministry wise, for the money.

⁶Therefore night will come over you, without visions, and darkness, without divination.

The sun will set for the prophets,

Isaiah 44:25

who foils the signs of false prophets and makes fools of diviners, who overthrows the learning of the wise and turns it into nonsense

Jeremiah 14:14

Then the LORD said to me, "The prophets are prophesying lies in my name. I have not sent them or appointed them or spoken to them. They are prophesying to you false visions, divinations, idolatries and the delusions of their own minds.

Jeremiah 23:16

This is what the LORD Almighty says: "Do not listen to what the prophets are prophesying to you; they fill you with false hopes. They speak visions from their own minds, not from the mouth of the LORD. Jeremiah 50:36

A sword against her false prophets! They will become fools. A sword against her warriors! They will be filled with terror.

Lamentations 2:14

The visions of your prophets were false and worthless; they did not expose your sin to ward off your captivity. The prophecies they gave you were false and misleading.

That's an interesting statement. Prophets are to "expose" sin and ward off captivity.

Finally, here's one from the many in the New Testament.

2 Peter 2:1

False Teachers and Their Destruction
But there were also false prophets among the people, just as there will be false teachers among you. They will secretly introduce destructive heresies, even denying the sovereign Lord who bought them—bringing swift destruction on themselves.

and the day will go dark for them.

⁷The seers will be ashamed and the diviners disgraced.

They will all cover their faces

because there is no answer from God."

The Bible has at least 17 references to "false" prophets, many of them in the New Testament.

⁸ But as for me, I am filled with power, with the Spirit of the LORD, and with justice and might, to declare to Jacob his transgression, to Israel his sin.

Contrast that statement about the role of the prophet with this one.
