Like it says in verse 3, "the LORD will not leave the guilty unpunished."

This phrase is echoed in two other places.

God used Assyria as the rod of hi anger against his covenant-breaking people in the days of Ahaz and in the days of Manasseh.

Babylonia was another hammer or club used by God to punish other nations.

Judah was Assyria's vassal, but that yoke would be broken. Here is another Scriptural example of a nation being used as a yoke. (Babylon)

Isaiah 11

¹³ Now I will break their yoke from your neck and tear your shackles away."

² This is what the LORD said to me: "Make a yoke out of straps and crossbars and put it on your neck. . . ⁵ With my great power and outstretched arm I made the earth and its people and the animals that are on it, and I give it to anyone I please. ⁶ Now I will give all your countries into the hands of my servant Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon; I will make even the wild animals subject to him. . . ⁸ ""If, however, any nation or kingdom will not serve Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon or bow its neck under his yoke, I will punish that nation with the sword, famine and plague, declares the LORD, until I destroy

it by his hand.

Back to Nineveh's punishment.

The Assyrian approach to life was doomed. It was part of broken, fallen humanity. God used the Babylonians and Medes to dig Nineveh's grave in 612 B.C.

Ezekiel speaks of this.

Ezekiel 32:22-23

²² "Assyria is there (the realm of the dead) with her whole army; she is surrounded by the graves of all her slain, all who have fallen by the sword. ²³ Their graves are in the depths of the pit and her army lies around her grave. All who had spread terror in the land of the living are slain, fallen by the sword.

Here is an account of the decisive fall of Nineveh in history.

The Battle of Nineveh is conventionally dated between 613 and 611 BC, with 612 BC being the most supported date. Rebelling against the Assyrians, an allied army which combined the forces of **Medes** and the **Babylonians**, besieged Nineveh and sacked 750 hectares of what was, at that time, one of the greatest cities in the world. The fall of Nineveh led to the destruction of the **Neo-Assyrian Empire** over the next three years[2] as the dominant state in the Ancient Near East. Archeological records show that the capital of the once mighty Assyrian Empire was extensively de-urbanized and depopulated in the decades and centuries following the battle. A garbled account of the fall of the city later led to the story of the legendary king Sardanapalus.

Babylon became the imperial center of **Mesopotamia** for the first time in over a thousand years, leading to the **Neo-Babylonian** Empire, claiming imperial continuity as a new dynasty.³

Let's wrap this chapter up.

Look, there on the mountains, the feet of one who brings good news, who proclaims peace!
Celebrate your festivals, Judah, and fulfill your vows.
No more will the wicked invade you; they will be completely destroyed.

So the NIV study bible says that this verse sets forth a principle that is applicable in several contexts of deliverance. Here the reference is the good news of the deliverance from the Assyrian threat. In Isaiah 52:7, it speaks of deliverance from Babylonian exile. In Romans 10:15, it speaks of deliverance from sin.

The Old Testament speaks to the Christian life and salvation in Jesus. Their deliverance was from evil nations. Ours is from sin, the flesh and the devil.
