graceWORKS! GOING DEEPER Ezekiel 38 – Part 2²

So---do all prophecies have to be fulfilled literally, to the word---or are some prophesied in the language of the day, but fulfilled in actuality in different ways? This prophecy about "Gog and Magog" shows up in the book of Revelation. How do we plumb it's meaning?

⁷When the thousand years are over, Satan will be released from his prison ⁸ and will go out to deceive the nations in the four corners of the earth—Gog and Magog—and to gather them for battle. In number they are like the sand on the seashore. ⁹ They marched across the breadth of the earth and surrounded the camp of God's people, the city he loves. But fire came down from heaven and devoured them. Revelation 20

I want to try to understand. We'll start with Revelation version first.

The Thousand Years

20 And I saw an angel coming down out of heaven, having the key to the Abyss and holding in his hand a great chain. ² He seized the dragon, that ancient serpent, who is the devil, or Satan, and bound him for a thousand years. ³ He threw him into the Abyss, and locked and sealed it over him, to keep him from deceiving the nations anymore until the thousand years were ended. After that, he must be set free for a short time.

⁴ I saw thrones on which were seated those who had been given authority to judge. And I saw the souls of those who had been beheaded because of their testimony about Jesus and because of the word of God. They (or "I also saw those who") had not worshiped the beast or its image and had not received its mark on their foreheads or their hands. They came to life and reigned with Christ a thousand years. ⁵ (The rest of the dead did not come to life until the thousand years were ended.) This is the first resurrection. ⁶ Blessed and holy are those who share in the first resurrection. The second death has no power over them, but they will be priests of God and of Christ and will reign with him for a thousand years.

The Judgment of Satan and the Attack of Gog and Magog

⁷When the thousand years are over, Satan will be released from his prison ⁸ and will go out to deceive the nations in the four corners of the earth—Gog and Magog—and to gather them for battle. In number they are like the sand on the seashore. ⁹They marched across the breadth of the earth and surrounded the camp of God's people, the city he loves. But fire came down from heaven and devoured them. ¹⁰ And the devil, who deceived them, was thrown into the lake of burning sulfur, where the beast and the false prophet had been thrown. They will be tormented day and night for ever and ever.

Ok. It's interesting (and probably NOT coincidental) that I'm going to be speaking on this on the First Sunday of Advent (this weekend). At least, I think I am! The first Sunday of Advent is about Hope, and it is supposed to begin with Christ's Second "Advent" or coming, and work its way down to the birth.


But let's let the NIV Study Bible notes (and some internet searches) help us flesh this out.

The NIV Study Bible says:

With regards to chapters 20 – 22 of Revelation.

"These last three chapters of reflect many of the subjects and themes of the first three chapters." In the introduction, it mentions how numbers are used symbolically in the book of Genesis. Apparently this was a common use of numbers in other ancient texts. These numbers include:

Take with you **seven** pairs of every kind of clean animal, **Genesis 7:3** and also **seven** pairs of every kind of bird **Genesis 7:4 Seven** days from now I will send rain on the earth **Genesis 7:10**

And after the **seven** days the floodwaters came on the earth.

In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, on the **seven**teenth day of the second month

 - In the Hebrew version of Genesis
 1:2, there are exactly
 14 words (twice seven).

Other symbolic numbers may include Enoch's 365 years (the exact number of days in a year, thus a full life). Since Genesis 1-3 and Revelation 20-22 parallel so dramatically, I wonder if that could

mean the numbers in Revelation are not so much spiritual as symbolic as well. Let's flesh this out further.

The Thousand Years

20 And I saw an angel coming down out of heaven, having the key to the Abyss and holding in his hand a great chain. 2 He seized the dragon, that ancient serpent, who is the devil, or Satan, and bound him for a thousand years. . .

⁴ I saw thrones on which were seated those who had been given authority to judge. . . So what's the deal about the 1000 years? Again, going back to the NIV. The phrase the "millennium" refers to this. It's taken from the Latin word for "the 1000 year" reign of the Saints and the imprisonment of Satan (1000 – mille, annus - year). "Mille annus" somehow in English comes our "millennium."

It is taken different ways by different students of Scriptures. You might ask, "How can that be so?" Aren't prophecies more exact than that?

The answer is, they aren't. Some prophecies and sayings in the Bible mean things that we won't know what they mean until they are fulfilled by God and declared by Him to be fulfilled.

Here are some key examples.

1. In Exodus 3:6, God says: "I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob."

On the surface, it looks like God is simply saying I am the God of your fathers to the Israelites. But look at how Christ explains what He says is either (or both) a prophesy and a theological proclamation.

Matthew 22:31-33 New International Version (NIV)

³¹ But about the resurrection of the dead—have you not read what God said to you, ³² 'I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob? He is not the God of the dead but of the living."

So this is a statement proving the resurrection of the dead. No one knew that's what it meant, until Christ proclaimed it to be that way.

2. The story of Jonah appeared to be just that---a historical account of what happened to Jonah. But Christ proclaimed it to be more, and showed it to be more. At His coming and especially at His death and resurrection, He showed it to mean that the Messiah would come alive from the dead after three days. Again, a case in point that you can't know the exact meanings of a prophecy until it's actually fulfilled and then to have God explain what it really meant in light of the fulfillment.

Jonah 1:17

[*Jonah's Prayer*] Now the Lord provided a huge fish to swallow Jonah, **and** Jonah was in the belly of the fish **three days and three nights**.

Matthew 12:40

For as Jonah was **three days and three nights** in the belly of a huge fish, so the Son of Man will be **three days and three nights** in the heart of the earth.

3. The Temple in the Bible was really a "type" or a prophecy about Christ and the church.

John 2:19-22 New International Version (NIV)

¹⁹ Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days."

²⁰ They replied, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and you are going to raise it in three days?" ²¹ But the temple he had spoken of was his body. ²² After he was raised from the dead, his disciples recalled what he had said. Then they believed the scripture and the words that Jesus had spoken.

1 Peter 2:4-7 New International Version (NIV)

The Living Stone and a Chosen People

⁴ As you come to him, the living Stone—rejected by humans but chosen by God and precious to him—⁵ you also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house^{[Or into a temple of the Spirit[]] to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶ For in Scripture it says:}

"See, I lay a stone in Zion, a chosen and precious cornerstone, and the one who trusts in him will never be put to shame."

⁷ Now to you who believe, this stone is precious. But to those who do not believe,

"The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone,"

4. Christ was the true Sabbath---again, the Sabbath wasn't about a day to be kept, as much as a Savior who's rest you were to enter.

Hebrews 4 New International Version (NIV)

A Sabbath-Rest for the People of God

4 Therefore, since the promise of entering his rest still stands, let us be careful that none of you be found to have fallen short of it. ² For we also have had the good news proclaimed to us, just as they did; but the message they heard was of no value to them, because they did not share the faith of those who obeyed.^{[or} because those who heard did not combine it with faith^{1 3} Now we who have believed enter that rest, just as God has said,

"So I declared on oath in my anger,

'They shall never enter my rest.'"

And yet his works have been finished since the creation of the world. ⁴ For somewhere he has spoken about the seventh day in these words: "On the seventh day God rested from all his works." ⁵ And again in the passage above he says, "They shall never enter my rest."

⁶ Therefore since it still remains for some to enter that rest, and since those who formerly had the good news proclaimed to them did not go in because of their disobedience, ⁷ God again set a certain day, calling it "Today." This he did when a long time later he spoke through David, as in the passage already quoted:

"Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts."

⁸ For if Joshua had given them rest, God would not have spoken later about another day. ⁹ There remains, then, a Sabbath-rest for the people of God; ¹⁰ for anyone who enters God's rest also rests from their works, just as God did from his.

Matthew 11:29 New International Version (NIV)

²⁹ Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.

5. The Virgin Birth of Christ.

Taken in its original conext, this verse had some actual historical meanings in the day of Isaiah.

Isaiah 7:14 New International Version (NIV)

¹⁴ Therefore the Lord himself will give you^[a] a sign: The virgin^[b] will conceive and give birth to a son, and^[c] will call him Immanuel.^[d]

Footnotes:

- 1. Isaiah 7:14 The Hebrew is plural.
- 2. Isaiah 7:14 Or young woman

The NIV allows for this to possibly mean that Isaiah's wife, a young woman (because the word can mean that), was going to have a son whose name "Immanuel" may be another name for "Maher-Shalal-Hash-Baz."

But look at what it ultimately meant.

Matthew 1:22-23 New International Version (NIV)

²² All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: ²³ "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel"^[a] (which means "God with us").

The point I'm making is this. We won't know what some prophecies mean until they are actually fulfilled, and some way or another, God lets us know "That is what the prophecy meant!" So, this allows us to discuss (next time)---the possible meaning of the 1000 years. And then the possible meaning of God and Magog below.

Revelation 20

Always remember:

1 Corinthians 13

⁸ Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away. ⁹ For **we know in part and we prophesy in part,** ¹⁰ but when completeness comes, what is in part disappears. ¹¹ When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put the ways of childhood behind me. ¹² For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror (or we're looking through a lens, or a prism)(or a "glass darkly"); then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.

¹³ And now these three remain: faith, **hope** and love. But the greatest of these is love.

We have this hope---I am with you always, even unto the end of the age!
