

# graceWORKS! GOING DEEPER Ezekiel 40 Part 3<sup>2</sup>

When you get into this, you'll see that all kinds of charts and drawings exist of this Temple. Some think it will actually be built. I personally think it is reflective of the Heavenly Temple, and creaturely representation of God's perfect atonement for us and the eternal ongoing sacrifice that Christ is for all times. That might look like "daily offerings" in our limited spatial and temporal world. But it's representative of a larger truth spoken of in Hebrews 10. <sup>14</sup> For by one sacrifice he has made perfect forever those who are being made holy. They are not literally being offered "day after day." But they eternally are being offered, as this parable Temple shows. What's next? Let's dig deeper!

## It was a massive complex. At least 8 football fields, side by side!

**EZEKIEL 40** 44 Outside the inner gate, within the inner court, there were chambers for the singers: <sup>x</sup>]  $one[^{y}]$  beside the north gate, facing south, and another beside the south[<sup>z</sup>] gate, facing north. 45 Then the man said to me, "This chamber that faces south is for the priests who keep charge of the temple. 46 The chamber that faces north is for the priests who keep charge of the altar. These are the sons of Zadok, the ones from the sons of Levi who may approach the LORD to serve him." 47 Next he measured the court. It was square, 175 feet long and 175 feet wide. The altar was in front of the temple.

## Ezekiel 40:38-43 (New International Version)

38 A room with a doorway was by the portico in each of the inner gateways, where the burnt offerings were washed. The Literal translation says "purged." It is translated washed, but I find it interesting that they think in terms of "purging," which sounds so much stronger. Christ was "purged" of the evil we had infected flesh with. We are too! Remember what Hebrews told us: he has made perfect forever those who are being made holy. We're perfect forever. But we're being made holy!

We're perfected "into the finality"-- carried through, i.e. (adverbially with G1519 and G3588 prefixed) perpetually is what the Greek word "dienekes" means. And we are still being "HOLY-ized." We're secure in our perfection, but we're being "HOLY-ized."

39 In the portico of the gateway were two tables on each side, on which the burnt offerings, sin offerings[<sup>a</sup>] and guilt offerings were slaughtered. 40 By the outside wall of the portico of the gateway, near the steps at the entrance of the north gateway were two tables, and on the other side of the steps were two tables. 41 So there were four tables on one side of the gateway and four on the other—eight tables in all—on which the sacrifices were slaughtered. 42 There were also four tables of dressed stone for the burnt offerings, each a cubit and a half long, a cubit and a half wide and a cubit high.[<sup>b</sup>] On them were placed the utensils for slaughtering the burnt offerings and the other sacrifices. 43 And double-pronged hooks, each **a handbreadth**[<sup>c</sup>] long, were attached to the wall all around. The tables were for the flesh of the offerings.

- 1. Ezekiel 40:39 Or purification offerings
- 2. Ezekiel 40:42 That is, about 2 2/3 feet long and wide and 21 inches high or about 80 centimeters long and wide and 53 centimeters high
- 3. Ezekiel 40:43 That is, about 3 1/2 inches or about 9 centimeters

# Ok, no big deal, but I was intrigued that they used "hand-breadths" to actually measure. I also think they used the length of the forearm (fingertip to elbow) for a cubit.

### But let's also note who the chambers were for.

44 Outside the inner gate, within the inner court, there were chambers for the singers:  $one[^{y}]$  beside the north gate, facing south, and another beside the south[<sup>z</sup>] gate, facing north.

There were  $^{7}$ two<sup>~</sup> rooms  $^{f}$  outside ' the inner gateway in the inner court,  $^{7}$ one<sup>~</sup> 'at the shoulder of the north gateway,  $^{+7its}$  facing<sup>~</sup> way \* south, and one 'at the shoulder of the  $^{7}$ south<sup>~</sup> gateway facing <sup>way</sup> \* north. (CLV)

# Interesting. They not only used handbreadths and forearm lengths, they used the human body to reference their dimensions. The gateway had "shoulders." Cool.

### Ok. So one of the shoulder rooms were for the "Singers." The Hebrew word is cool here.
